


Eddie Payan and Conor Morrin each pitched in assists in the victory as Kyle Tencza recorded six saves in the shutout.

You high school guys...You’ll see. You won’t believe it can happen to you, but you’ll be saying stuff like this!


Again with “Ryan”???

BIRD OF THE WEEK: BELTED KINGFISHER



November 8 –
Allendale, NJ – There are so many things I love about birding. That likely does not come as a surprise to many of you.

This weekend, there was a rare opportunity to bird in November. This is typically a busy time, but I was able to bird Cape May Point on Saturday and received a

text from a former teammate who asked to go out. What a great time to be able to spend with my good friend! We took to the paths and perches of the Celery Farm in Allendale, NJ.

The Celery Farm was an actual working celery farm at one point in history. It is currently a nature park where hundreds of species have been spotted throughout the decades.

As we made it half way around the park, we stepped off and took a bridge less travelled. It led us to a second pond to the north that was as still as a sheet of glass.

One of the things that drew me, was the familiar call of one of my favorite birds, the belted kingfisher. As we

noted the call, he asked the question... Why does it make that sound? This is one of the gifts of birding...you never run out of questions. I generally have a good answer like, "What do you call a deer that can't see?" "No eye deer?"

Don't even start me on that one. That could go on a while. But I revel in the ability to use this new invention called a google. I might even use an older invention called the *Roger Tory Peterson Field Guide to Eastern Birds*. Sometimes *Sibley's Field Guide* is a good resource and the mother of all (sans photos) is *The Birder's Handbook: A Field Guide to the Natural History of North American Birds*.

Forget google. Just remember Cornell University's [allaboutbirds.org](https://www.allaboutbirds.org). That's THE site. Look up any specie and listen to its call. Read most of what you need to know about a bird to sound somewhat intelligent. It's awesome.



A friend described her as a punk rocker, with the funky doo atop her head. A considerably long bill gives this bird a unique appearance.

This is a relatively easy bird to sex, if you can get a good enough look at it. The female is actually the more colorful bird, with the lovely chestnut markings on her sides and belly. The males are purely white.

As our walk concluded, we took time to finish talking about our families, our hopes, our fears. We shared ourselves as friends do, reflecting on the role athletics plays in our lives and in the lives of our children.

While starting roles and winning games are nice, we agreed, the kingfisher could care less. That's not what gets her up in the morning, nor what keeps her sleepless at night.

It will be the health and well-being of her chicks and seeing them off, out of the nest so they can become their own kingfisher.
